2. District Report

Mr. Banning explained the role of the District Advisory Council Representatives. They meet monthly and each of the nine schools host and present. Representatives bring information from their schools to the meetings for discussions, while receiving informative presentations from the district and Superintendent Banning. Three years ago the representatives also began advising on the LCAP as well. Director Liz Barnitz explained the role of the DELAC representatives. They advise the district's governing board regarding programs and services for English Learners, primarily, reclassification and EL development (ELD).

4. School Report by Sarah Bautista – New Principal El Camino School

Mrs. Bautista shared her presentation of El Camino School. The school has 251 students and 12 regular education classrooms. They also have a TK class and a State preschool on site, as well as the ASES Afterschool Program. Out of 251 students 118 are English learners. Mrs. Bautista shared assessment scores and explained the typical day schedule and after school enrichment opportunities. She shared family and community events. The school is preparing to celebrate Kermesse, a community festival for families tonight. El Camino is one of the "No Excuses University" Schools, which embrace setting goals to accomplish college aspirations while adopting colleges around the country for inspiration. College students come to the campus to have lunch with the students. Her school has recently implemented the program, Makerspace, which takes place on Fridays when the PTA funded teaching staff work in 4 classrooms where students gather to work on projects based in Science, Art and Engineering.

5. District Update/Reports

Superintendent Banning reviewed the LCAP, explaining each of the goals and how they are being accomplished. He presented a condensed version of the 50-page LCAP document recapping the five goals (State priorities). He also discussed future topics for DAC meetings and schedules.

6. School Tech Reports

The school representatives discussed programs and ongoing technology at each of their sites.
