1. Welcome and Introductions

Bridget Braney opened the meeting at 9:17 am. She reviewed the events of the past month, the staff and parent survey, and then shared the district procedures from counseling at the schools and covering staff that couldn't get to work due to the mudslides and closed freeway. Cressida Silvers asked that representatives introduce themselves, since there are new members.

3. LCAP Review – Dr. Bridget Braney

Dr. Braney shared handouts for LCAP goals and Data Analysis. She reviewed the California Way (a state-wide initiative to continuously improve meeting the needs of our students). She stated that the LCAP addresses the state priorities and asked DAC representatives what priorities are most important to them. Representatives then met in groups and shared information of what their sites are doing to address LCFF priorities. Dr. Braney also explained, "unduplicated students" as students getting counted for only one disadvantage even if they qualify for more. She shared assessment scores and broke them down by different student groups.

4. School Report –

Sarah Bautista, Principal at El Camino, shared her presentation of El Camino School. El Camino is one of the "No Excuses University" Schools, which embrace setting goals to accomplish college aspirations while adopting colleges around the country for inspiration. The No Excuses University is a network of 250 schools in the US. The school has 257 students and a State preschool on site with 24 children. Out of 257 students 127 are English learners, (108 native Spanish speakers) with 9 languages other than English. Mrs. Bautista shared the typical instructional day schedule and after school enrichment opportunities. El Camino also is home to the ASES (After School Education & Safety) program. This year the PTA hired 3 teachers to teach classes such as; yoga, art, science, and robotics, during conference time instead of offering movies. She shared that the annual Kermesse celebration, a community festival for families, was rescheduled for February due to the Thomas Fire. El Camino also offers Makerspace classes in the STEAM Institute during the school day. More programs include: K Success Institute funded by the United Way, Journey through Jazz, Math Club for 4-6th grades, Computers for Families, Noon League, Safe Routes to School. Some evening activities include, Dolphin Book Festival (formerly Reading Under the Stars) which features a noted author, Math Night and Science Night.
