1. Welcome and Introductions

Dr. Lewis welcomed members and Cressida Silvers began the meeting at 9:19 a.m. with DAC members. She welcomed members and had an introduction, Dr. Lewis reviewed last months meeting topic, Cultural Proficiency.

2. Approval of the Minutes from March 1, 2018

3. School Presentation – Kim Bruzzese, Kellogg Principal

Mrs. Bruzzese shared a Powerpoint presentation of an overall look at Kellogg School. Student demographics are 41% white, 38% Hispanic, 11% Asian and 10% Multi-ethnic. Socioeconomic background for students are 28% socioeconomically disadvantaged and 72% not. Kellogg has 16 different languages being spoken and students are 70% English only and 30% English learners. Mrs. Bruzzese shared that this year they have implemented the new district-wide English Language Arts Program, Wonders, and are currently restructuring the designated ELD structures to match ELA/ELD standards by grade level. They continue to use Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) to provide intervention and differentiation to monitor progress for student success. Kellogg is continuing an emphasis on Differentiated Learning strategies across all grade levels. The district has provided DI training to teachers in grades 2 through 6. Second Step, the social emotional curriculum, has been embraced across all grade levels. Kellogg houses the district Autism program and they are one of a few schools that implemented the recess before lunch scheduling.

4. LCAP/Parent Input

Dr. Bridget Braney explained the current Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) and shared an abbreviated version with the representatives. She reviewed the California Way, that the state has been working on for the past 15 years or so, which includes, state standards, Blueprints for design for Great Schools, County Offices that help distribute what the model school should look like and how to continue continuous improvement and Smarter Balance Testing, LCFF (8 State priorities, 1-6 for elementary). The state requires schools to create a plan of how to spend funds that meet the needs of students that need additional support – unduplicated students- measuring the achievement gap. Dr. Braney grouped reps and had them review the parent survey form to identify the data points, discuss why is this data important and then determine the next steps.

5. Site Rep Discussion – Testing and Differentiation

Dr. Braney shared a handout and explained the Assessment ABC's (Smarter Balanced, KSET, STAR, CPM, CELDT, Bridges, Wonders and Writing Prompts). She reviewed the different tests and assessments.
